DYMCHURCH **RECREATION GROUND**

Dymchurch Parish Council are please to announce that the very much loved recreation ground is now protected for people to enjoy in perpetuity thanks to a Deed of Dedication established in partnership with Fields In Trust. A wooden plaque shown in the picture being held proudly by vice Chair Cathy Young will be displayed in the future. Plans to reinvigorate the Pavilion have slowed due to the Corona Virus however the use of the open

space has seen a rise in groups interested in getting people out into the fresh air. Local keep fit groups, football academy and the Grasshoppers football teams are making use of the open space. We have even had a choir filling the space with song and a group of people improving their line dancing skills.

Depending on Government restrictions the Parish Council have secured funding to work with Active Spaces to provide free exercise classes for people of all levels and abilities to get out into the fresh air and take that step to a healthier future. On the Pavilion, the Parish Council have created a working group to over see the future management of the pavilion and the recreation ground by the Friends of Dymchurch Recreation Ground Charity (CIO No 1185857). This project has the ambition of bringing the Pavilion back into public use, giving access to all and protecting the building for future generations. The Charity has an enthusiastic and energetic group of trustees and volunteers keen to see this through to success. Keep a check on our website to see how the story unfolds.



LEST WE FORGET It was a chance visit to the Dymchurch Parish Council Offices by Geoff Withers ex-service man and member of the Royal British Legion who suggested it would be a good idea for a memorial bench to be placed in the Garden of

Remembrance at New Hall Dymchurch for people to sit and reflect in comfort. At the end of September 2020 the village finally took delivery and installation of a wonderful bench (pictured) depicting all of the services who fought and gave their lives. The bench, which was funded by the Royal British Legion at Dymchurch and the Parish Council, now sits proudly in the garden and hopefully will be used by residents and visitors for many years to come.

SEAWALL KIOSK **REFURBISHMENT**

The Seawall Kiosk is one of the Councils main assets and as such ensuring its safety and condition was agreed as a priority. In order to recoup some of the outlay for the refurbishment and with no time to find a temporary licensee one of the Council Officers began running the kiosk setting things up in a matter of days much to the praise of people visiting our wonderful beach. It goes without saying that all of the profits will be used for the good of the village. CARPARK FACELIFT

After a successful bid to the High Street Regeneration Fund (set up to encourage the return to traditional highstreets and support local businesses), the Parish Council matched the funding awarded to finally resurface the Parish Council Carpark. This long over due refurbishment has been welcomed by many in the village. In 2021 the Council hope to introduce electrical charging points working in partnership with Kent County Council. It is hoped this will support the move to cleaner methods of travel especially in rural areas

CENSUS 2021 WILL PROVIDE A SNAPSHOT OF MODERN SOCIETY

Households across Folkestone and Hythe District will soon be asked to take part in Census 2021.

The census is a once-in-a-decade survey that gives us the most accurate estimate of all the people and households in England and Wales. It has been carried out every decade since 1801, with the exception of 1941. It will be the first run predominantly online, with households receiving a letter with a unique access code, allowing them to complete the questionnaire on their computers, phones or tablets. “A successful census will ensure everyone from local government to charities can put services and funding in the places where they are most needed,” Iain Bell, deputy national statistician at the Office for National Statistics, said. “This could mean things like doctors’ surgeries, schools and new transport routes. That’s why it is so important everyone takes part and we have made it easier for people to do so online on any device, with help and paper questionnaires for those that need them.” Census day will be on March 21, but households across the country will receive letters with online codes allowing them to take part from early March. The census will include questions about your sex, age, work, health, education, household size and ethnicity. And, for the first time, there will be a question asking people whether they have served in the armed forces, as well as voluntary questions for those aged 16 and over on sexual orientation and gender identity. Results will be available within 12 months, although personal records will be locked away for 100 years, kept safe for future generations. For more information, visit census.gov.uk.



PROTECT THE PLANET TWO MINUTES AT A TIME

Dymchurch Parish Council have partnered with The 2 Minute Foundation which is a registered charity devoted to cleaning up our planet two minutes at a time. This

year more than ever saw a steep rise in the amount of litter left in our parish. Soon a litter station (pictured above) will be installed on the side of the sea wall kiosk to encourage you to spend just two minutes picking litter and depositing it in the public bins. 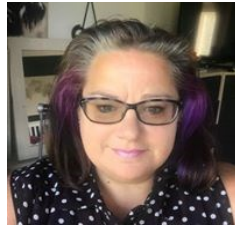

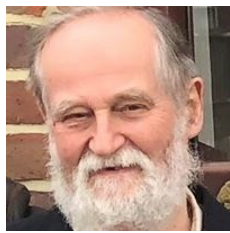
